After graduating from Brentwood and obtaining a B.A. from Simon Fraser University, George Killy returned to his home of Prince George and soon became one of the province's most innovative and successful entrepreneurs in the central and north British Columbia forest industry. While designing, building, and operating Lakeland Mills, one of Canada's award-winning full recovery lumber companies, George also served as Vice Chairman of the Rivers Committee in Prince George, advising the city on land use issues pertaining to local rivers. These efforts led to a public access riverfront trail in the heart of Prince George. Currently, George owns and operates Harley Street Holdings Inc., a Vancouver based investment company. Among his many outside involvements, he is Chair Emeritus of the Vancouver Art Gallery, a Director of the Vancouver Art Gallery Foundation, Chair of the Springtide Invitational Golf Tournament, Trustee of The Keg Royalties Income Fund, Director of Keg General Partner Ltd., a former Director of the Vancouver 2010 Bid Corporation, and a former Ambassador of the Vancouver Organizing Committee for the 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games. George is also past Chair of Grid International Inc. of Austin, Texas, past Director and Corporate Secretary of the Nature Trust of British Columbia, a former Director of the BC Children's Hospital Foundation, Past President of the Council on North Interior Forest Employees Relations (Conifer), and co-recipient of the Canada Awards for Excellence – 1984 Gold Medal – for Labour Management Co-operation in Implementing Technological Change.
